Welcome to our Summer Newsletter. We hope you've all had a lovely, relaxing Easter.

We are all very excited about the term ahead as it is shaping up to be very busy and full of fun! We will be starting the term by continuing some of the topics we started before the Easter holiday; we have a few 'loose ends' to tie up!



Topics:

After finishing off a few jobs, we will then start our new Geography unit of 'Source to Sea'. Here, we will be acting as geologists and looking at how rivers change as they move towards the sea. We will have the chance to go down to the River Meon (mapping its course) and conduct some field-work as well as use our enquiry based learning approach to study the Nile. Our Art unit will involve creating willow fish which will link to our river topic.



In English, after finishing 'Holes', we will be looking at inspirational sporting stories as a stimulus for writing, before Year 5 move onto reading the wonderful *Kensuke's Kingdom* by Michael Morpurgo.

In Science, we will spend the term exploring 'Living Things and their Habitats' which will also have links to river environments.

In DT we will be designing and creating suspension bridges (with a set criteria list as an extra challenge!) This will be linked to our previous Maths learning as we will be developing our concepts of angles and measurements in a practical context, through the work of Norman Foster.

In Maths, children will finish the curriculum, with a particular focus on statistics, before spending the remaining academic year revisiting and overlearning key concepts previously taught.

On the week beginning the 12th of May, Year 6 will sit their KS2 SATs.

Helping your child at home

The summer reading diaries will be going out soon. We encourage children to continue to read a range of texts over the summer term as this will have a huge impact on both their reading and writing in school. Listening to your children read, for all children, is really important as this will help to build their understanding. You can also share what you like/dislike about the book and have discussions about the various characters.

Learning the 12x12 tables fluently will also be hugely beneficial to children so continue to encourage practising these. Not knowing these is one of the biggest barriers to learning in maths. Please continue to practice times tables weekly!

In order to help with the smooth running of the Summer Production, we ask that children take the responsibility to learn their lines and song words over the half term and onwards so they have the confidence to get fully involved in rehearsals and embrace their roles.
