Welcome to our **Autumn Newsletter**.

Our **History Topic** this term is '**Stone Age to Iron Age**'. In this history based unit, we will be finding out about how people lived in Britain during the **Stone-Age** and discovering how life changed through the **Bronze and Iron Ages**. The highlight of this unit will be our fascinating trip to **Butser Hill Ancient Farm** where the children will be immersed in life during these times.



In **English** this term, we will be starting with a unit based around **Portal Stories** (Alice in Wonderland, Narnia, The Tunnel), before moving on to look at a range of **fiction, non-fiction and poetry**. In **Maths**, children will focus on their **place value, calculation (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division)** and **problem solving skills** in a range of contexts as well as consolidation of times tables.

In **Science**, we will be learning all about **humans and other animals** with a focus on the **skeletal and digestive systems**. In **Art**, we will be using a range of techniques to create **self- portraits** while in **DT** we will be **baking bread**. **PE** will be **Invasion games and OAA**. In **computing**, we will be looking at **E-safety** and learning how to **debug** programmes. In **RE**, we will be looking at **rituals** and learning about Mary, Mother of God and in **PDL** we will be focusing on using the **zones of regulation** for our emotional wellbeing. Finally, in **Music** the children will learn about the pentatonic scale.

Another highlight of the term will be the **Year 3 and 4 Christmas Service**. We are looking forward to every child being involved in some way, whether it's acting, reading, dancing or singing as it's a fantastic way to boost confidence as well as develop those teamwork skills. We will endeavour to let you know in plenty of time if your children need costumes.
