Welcome to our **Autumn Newsletter**. We look forward to welcoming you all back after a relaxing and enjoyable summer holiday!

As part of our History topic on **Ancient Egypt**, we will be learning all about life in these times, including the **River Nile**, pyramids, **everyday life** and, of course, **mummies!** We will focus on historical enquiry skills and encourage children to identify historical questions and find out the answers for themselves.



In English, we will be studying Linda Newbury's '**Lob**' in our unit '**In the Garden**' as well as Shakespeare's **A Midsummer Night's Dream** before immersing the children in a poetry unit. We will use these texts as a springboard to some amazing pieces of writing including narrative, diaries and creating our own poems!

Linking to our 'In the Garden' unit, our first science topic is **Plants** where we will be focusing on **germination and pollination**. The following half term, we will learning about what the Earth is made from in our '**Rocks and Soils**' unit.

Our music and art lessons will be linked to History as we learn about **Egyptian music** and **rhythms** and create **Egyptian 'death masks'** using modelling materials. In the second half term, we will move on to DT where children will explore **Egyptian food**. In RE we will explore Judaism by looking at **Sukkot's** and **Hanukkah**. **E-safety** is really important to us, so children will be reminded of how to stay safe online by using email and video conferencing. In **PDL**, we will be looking at **healthy relationships** and how we respect ourselves and others.

Another highlight of the term will be the **Year 3 and 4 Christmas Service**. We are looking forward to every child being involved in some way, whether its acting, reading, dancing or singing as it's a fantastic way to boost confidence as well as develop those teamwork skills. We will endeavour to let you know in plenty of time if your children need costumes.
