



Sports Premium allocation plan 2021 - 2022

In the academic year of 2021 - 2022, Droxford Junior School intends to spend the Government funded sports premium (£17,820) on the following initiatives designed to build further capacity in all areas.

We aim to target 5 key indicators;

- 1 - The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
- 2 - Raise the profile of Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity across the school.
- 3 - Upskill all staff, including their confidence and knowledge in teaching PE and School Sport.
- 4 - Provide a broader range of sports and activities to all pupils.
- 5 - Increase participation in competitive sport.

Initiative	Est. Cost	Indicator	Intended outcome
PE Equipment	£1000	1 & 4	PE supplies which have been worn, damaged or lost will be replaced.
CPD	£7500	2 & 3	A specialist sports coach will be employed to work alongside class teachers. This will result in an increase in staff confidence and knowledge and therefore impact the quality of PE lessons.
Team Kits	£300	5	New kits will be bought for a range of different sports teams.
Active playground	£3000	1	Employ a lunch leader to organise a safe zoned playground where children have the opportunity to lead healthy and active lifestyles. This helps support children to be more active.
School Sport opportunities	£2500	4 & 5	Continue to provide opportunities for children to compete in Level 1 & 2 competitions. Will allow time for coaching with a sports coach.
Swimming	£2000	1 & 4	Children will attend swimming lessons with a qualified swimming teacher with the aim to increase the % of children who are able to swim 25m, perform different strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue. This will also cover costs of assisting travel to and from the local pool.
Enrichment Activities	£500	1 & 4	Cover costs of Healthy schools week workshops (including sports day). Chichester University visit.
Interventions	£1000	1	Provide children who need extra support on their physical development with support from a qualified sports coach.

A sports coach is employed to provide sports activities during lunchtime. Den building equipment was sourced, enhancing active play. Shoe storage was bought, allowing children to use the school field, resulting in more space for active play.

Swimming & Water Safety

All children get the opportunity to participate in swimming lessons during their time at Droxford Junior School. To meet the requirements of the PE national curriculum, children in years 3 & 4 get taken to a local swimming pool for a term of swimming with qualified swimming teachers. In addition to this, year 5 children go on a water sport residential where they are further taught about water safety. Parents complete a survey on their children's swimming ability prior to this residential. The table below shows the percentages of the year 6 cohort when they left Droxford Junior School. These figures are formed from swimming assessments from the school swimming programme.
