



Sports Premium allocation plan 2022 - 2023

In the academic year of 2022 - 2023, Droxford Junior School intends to spend the Government funded sports premium (£17,765) on the following initiatives designed to build further capacity in all areas.

We aim to target 5 key indicators;

- 1 - Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 2 - Engagement of all pupils in regular physical education.
- 3 - The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 4 - Broader experience of a range of sports and physical activities offered to all pupils.
- 5 - Increased participation in competitive sport.
