In the academic year of 2023 - 2024, Droxford Junior School has spent the Government funded sports premium (£17,772) on the following initiatives.

Swimming outcomes

All children get the opportunity to participate in swimming lessons during their time at Droxford Junior School. To meet the requirements of the PE national curriculum, children in Years 3 & 4 get taken to a local swimming pool for a term of swimming with qualified swimming teachers. In addition to this, Year 5 children go on a 3 day sailing residential where they are further taught about water safety in specific situations. For this, parents complete a survey on their child's swimming ability and sailing confidence prior to this residential. These figures are formed from swimming assessments from the school swimming and water safety programme.
